Meaning: Victory and glory to Lord Ganesha. Goddess Parvati is his mother and Lord Mahadeva, or Shiva, is his father.

Ekadanta Dayavanta

Mathe Par Tilak Sohe, Muse Ki Savari.**

Meaning: Lord Ganesha is the compassionate one-tusked deity who is traditionally shown with four arms. A sacred mark shines upon his forehead, and the mouse is his vehicle.

Paan Chadhe, Phool Chadhe

**Paan Chadhe, Phool Chadhe, Aur Chadhe Meva,
Ladduan Ka Bhog Lage, Sant Karen Seva.**

Meaning: Devotees offer betel leaves, flowers, fruits, dry fruits and Laddoos to Lord Ganesha. Saints and devotees worship him with love and devotion.

Andhan Ko Aankh Det

**Andhan Ko Aankh Det, Kodhin Ko Kaya,
Banjhan Ko Putra Det, Nirdhan Ko Maya.**

Meaning: The verse praises Lord Ganesha as a compassionate deity who blesses devotees with guidance, healing, family

happiness and material support according to traditional belief.

Sur Shyam Sharan Aaye

**Sur Shyam Sharan Aaye, Safal Kije Seva,
Mata Jaki Parvati, Pita Mahadeva.**

Meaning: The devotee comes to the refuge of Lord Ganesha and prays that the worship offered with devotion may be accepted and made meaningful.

Who Is Lord Ganesha?

Lord Ganesha is one of the most widely worshipped deities in Hindu tradition. He is known as the son of Lord Shiva and Goddess Parvati and is remembered before beginning any auspicious activity.

His important names include:

- Ganapati – Lord of the Ganas
- Vinayaka – Supreme guide and leader
- Vighnaharta – Remover of obstacles
- Ekadanta – The one-tusked Lord
- Lambodara – The Lord with a large abdomen
- Gajanana – The deity with a majestic elephant-like face
- Siddhivinayaka – The giver of success and fulfilment
- Mangal Murti – The embodiment of auspiciousness

When Is Ganesh Aarti Performed?

Ganesh Aarti may be performed every day. It is especially recited during:

- Morning and evening home worship
- Ganesh Chaturthi
- Ganesh Visarjan

- Sankashti Chaturthi
- Angaraki Sankashti
- Wednesday Ganesh Puja
- Weddings and engagement ceremonies
- Housewarming and Vastu Puja
- Opening a new shop, office or business
- Beginning education or a new project
- Family celebrations and religious ceremonies

How to Perform Ganesh Aarti at Home

1. Clean the Puja Area

Clean the home altar or worship space and place an idol or picture of Lord Ganesha on a raised platform.

2. Light a Diya

Light a ghee or oil lamp and place it safely in front of Lord Ganesha.

3. Offer Puja Items

Depending on availability, offer:

- Turmeric and Kumkum
- Sandalwood paste
- Akshata
- Fresh flowers
- Durva grass
- Modak or Laddoo
- Fruit
- Jaggery and coconut

4. Chant a Ganesh Mantra

Chant the following mantra 11 times:

Om Gam Ganapataye Namah.

You may also recite:

**Vakratunda Mahakaya Suryakoti Samaprabha,
Nirvighnam Kuru Me Deva Sarva-Karyeshu Sarvada.**

5. Sing the Ganesh Aarti

Place a lit diya or camphor in an Aarti plate and move it gently in a clockwise circular motion before Lord Ganesha while singing the complete Aarti.

Keep the flame away from curtains, loose clothing, children and pets.

6. Offer Flowers and Namaskar

After the Aarti, offer flowers or Akshata and bow before Lord Ganesha.

7. Distribute Prasad

Offer the Naivedya as Prasad to family members after completing the prayer.

Short Ganesh Aarti for Daily Worship

When there is not enough time to sing the full Aarti, the main verse may be repeated three times:

**Jai Ganesh, Jai Ganesh, Jai Ganesh Deva,
Mata Jaki Parvati, Pita Mahadeva.**

After this, chant:

Om Gam Ganapataye Namah.

End with a simple prayer:

0 Lord Ganesha, bless us with wisdom, patience and the strength to overcome difficulties through honest effort and right action.

Spiritual Meaning of Ganesh Aarti

Ganesh Aarti is not only a request for obstacles to disappear. Its deeper message is to seek the wisdom required to recognise and overcome them.

The Aarti encourages devotees to develop:

- Clear thinking
- Patience during difficulties
- Humility before beginning new work
- Discipline and self-control
- Respect for parents and family
- Gratitude for available blessings
- Faith supported by sincere effort

Meaning of the Symbols Mentioned in Ganesh Aarti

Symbol	Spiritual Meaning
Ekadanta	Concentration, sacrifice and dedication to one purpose
Four arms	Divine strength and the ability to guide different aspects of life
Tilak	Spiritual awareness and auspiciousness
Mouse vehicle	Control over restless desires and wandering thoughts
Laddoo	The sweetness and satisfaction of wisdom
Flowers	Love, purity and devotion

Symbol	Spiritual Meaning
Aarti flame	The light of knowledge that removes inner darkness

According to devotional belief, singing Ganesh Aarti regularly may help a devotee:

- Strengthen devotion to Lord Ganesh
- Begin the day with positive thoughts
- Develop mental calmness
- Create a peaceful atmosphere at home

- Reflect on personal actions and decisions
- Seek wisdom before starting important work

8. Can Ganesh Aarti be performed without an idol?

Yes. It may be sung before a picture of Lord Ganesha or while meditating upon him mentally.

9. How many times should Ganesh Aarti be

sung?

The complete Aarti is usually sung once. The main refrain may be repeated after every verse.

10. What should be prayed for after Ganesh Aarti?

Pray for wisdom, good judgement, self-control, family welfare and the strength to perform duties honestly.
