

Ganesh Stuti in English – Complete Lyrics with Meaning and Recitation Method

Ganesh Stuti is a devotional hymn praising Lord Ganesha as the first worshipped deity, the lord of the Ganas, the giver of wisdom and the remover of obstacles. It may be recited during daily worship, Ganesh Chaturthi, Sankashti Chaturthi, weddings, housewarming ceremonies and before beginning an important task.

Different prayers are popularly known as “Ganesh Stuti.” The version given in this article is traditionally known as **Devaih Kritam Ganesh Stotram**, a hymn in which the deities praise and seek the refuge of Lord Ganesha.

This Ganesh Stuti describes Ganesha’s divine position, childhood activities, compassionate nature, mouse vehicle and power to control obstacles.

Ganesh Stuti Lyrics in English with Meaning

Opening Prayer

Shri Ganeshaya Namah.

Meaning: Salutations to the auspicious Lord Ganesha.

Verse 1

Deva Uchuh:

**Yah Sarva-Karyeshu Sada Suranam
Apisha-Vishnv-Ambuja-Sambhavanam.**

**Pujyo Namasyah Parichintaniyas
Tam Vighnarajam Sharanam Vrajamah.**

English Meaning

The deities said: We seek refuge in Lord Vighnaraja, who is worshipped, honoured and remembered at the beginning of every activity by the gods and even by Lord Shiva, Lord Vishnu and Brahma, who was born from the lotus.

Spiritual Message

Remembering Lord Ganesha before beginning a task represents proper preparation, humility and clarity of intention. It reminds a devotee not to begin important work with carelessness or pride.

Verse 2

**Na Vighnarajena Samosti Kashchid
Devo Mano-Vanchhita-Sampradata.
Nishchitya Chaitat Tripurantakopi
Tam Pujayamasa Vadhe Puranam.**

English Meaning

There is no deity equal to Lord Vighnaraja in granting the sincere wishes of devotees. Knowing this, even Lord Shiva, the destroyer of Tripura, worshipped Ganesha before setting out to defeat the three cities.

Spiritual Message

Even great ability requires wisdom, planning and the right beginning. The verse teaches that strength should be accompanied by humility and thoughtful action.

Verse 3

Karotu Sosmakam Avighnam Asmin

**Mahakratau Satvaram Ambikeyah.
Dhyatena Yenakhila-Deha-Bhajam
Purna Bhavishyanti Manobhilashah.**

English Meaning

May the son of Goddess Ambika quickly remove every obstacle from this sacred undertaking. Through meditation upon him, the auspicious aspirations of living beings are fulfilled.

Spiritual Message

The prayer does not only ask for problems to disappear. It seeks the wisdom and patience needed to complete duties properly.

Verse 4

**Mahotsavobhud Akhilasya Devya
Jatah Sutash Chintita-Matra Eva.
Ato Vadann Sura-Sanghah Kritarthah
Sadyojatam Vighnarajam Namantah.**

English Meaning

When the divine son was born through the intention of the Goddess, the entire world rejoiced. The assembled deities bowed to the newly born Lord of obstacles and considered themselves blessed.

Spiritual Message

The birth of Lord Ganesha represents joy, hope and a new beginning. The verse encourages devotees to welcome positive changes with gratitude.

Verse 5

**Yo Matur Utsanga-Gatotha Matra
Nivaryamanopi Balachcha Chandram.**

**Sangopayamasa Pitur Jatasu
Ganadhinathasya Vinoda Eshah.**

English Meaning

While seated on his mother's lap, the child Ganesha playfully reached for the Moon adorning Lord Shiva. Even when his mother tried to stop him, he hid it among his father's matted locks. Such was the delightful play of the lord of the Ganas.

Spiritual Message

This poetic episode presents the innocent and joyful childhood form of Ganesha. Spiritual life includes love, happiness and simplicity along with discipline.

Verse 6

**Papau Stanam Matur Athapi Tripto
Yo Bhratri-Matsarya-Kashaya-Buddhih.
Lambodaras Tvam Bhava Vighnarajo
Lambodaram Nama Chakara Shambhuh.**

English Meaning

Even after being satisfied, the child continued drinking his mother's milk with the innocent competitiveness of childhood. Lord Shiva affectionately gave him the name Lambodara, the one with the large abdomen.

Spiritual Message

Ganesha's large abdomen is commonly understood as a symbol of the ability to accept and contain the many experiences, joys and difficulties of life.

Verse 7

**Samveshtito Deva-Ganair Maheshah
Pravartatam Nrityam Itity Uvacha.**

**Santoshito Nupura-Rava-Matrad
Ganeshvaratvebhishishecha Putram.**

English Meaning

Surrounded by divine beings, Lord Mahesha asked his son to dance. Delighted by the beautiful sound of Ganesha's anklets, Lord Shiva appointed and consecrated him as the lord of the Ganas.

Spiritual Message

The dance represents joy, rhythm and creativity. When talent is combined with discipline and responsibility, it can develop into true leadership.

Verse 8

**Yo Vighna-Pasham Cha Karena Bibhrat
Skandhe Kutharam Cha Tatha Parena.
Apujito Vighnam Athopi Matuh
Karoti Ko Vighnapateh Samonyah.**

English Meaning

Lord Ganesha carries the noose that controls obstacles and an axe that cuts harmful attachments. When his importance is ignored, even an important undertaking may face difficulties. Who else can equal the lord of obstacles?

Spiritual Message

The noose represents control over attachment and restless desires. The axe symbolises the power to cut through ignorance, pride and harmful habits.

Verse 9

**Dharmartha-Kamadishu Purva-Pujyo
Devasuraih Pujyata Eva Nityam.**

**Yasyarchanam Naiva Vinasham Asti
Tam Purva-Pujyam Prathamam Namami.**

English Meaning

Lord Ganesha is worshipped first in pursuits connected with Dharma, prosperity and rightful desires. Both gods and other divine beings honour him. I first bow to that eternally worshipped Lord.

Spiritual Message

Material progress and personal desires should be guided by Dharma, wisdom and ethical conduct.

Verse 10

**Yasyarchanat Prarthanayanurupam
Drishtva Tu Sarvasya Phalasya Siddhim.
Svatantra-Samarthya-Kritati-Garvam
Bhratri-Priyam Tv Akhuratham Tam Ide.**

English Meaning

I praise Lord Ganesha, whose worship is associated with the fulfilment of sincere prayers, who possesses independent divine power, who is affectionate towards his brother and whose vehicle is the mouse.

Spiritual Message

The mouse is often interpreted as the restless mind and uncontrolled desire. Ganesha riding upon it symbolises wisdom governing impulses and wandering thoughts.

Verse 11

**Yo Mataram Sarasair Nritya-Gitais
Tathabilashair Akhilair Vinodaih.
Santoshayamasa Tadatitushtam**

Tam Shri-Ganesham Sharanam Prapadye.

English Meaning

I seek refuge in Shri Ganesha, who delighted Goddess Parvati through graceful dance, melodious songs, loving actions and joyful play.

Spiritual Message

Bringing happiness to parents through respect, affection and good conduct is itself an important form of devotion.

Verse 12

**Suropakarair Asuraish Cha Yuddhaih
Stotrair Namaskara-Paraish Cha Mantraih.
Pitri-Prasadena Sada Samriddham
Tam Shri-Ganesham Sharanam Prapadye.**

English Meaning

I seek refuge in Shri Ganesha, who is enriched by his service to the gods, his victories over harmful forces, the hymns and mantras offered by devotees and the blessings of his divine father.

Spiritual Message

True prosperity is not limited to wealth. Service, courage, good character, family blessings and the trust of others are also forms of abundance.

Verse 13

**Jaye Purnam Akarot Pratipam
Pitrapi Harshat Pratipujito Yah.
Nirvighnatam Chapi Punash Chakara
Tasmai Ganeshaya Namaskaromi.**

English Meaning

During the campaign against the three cities, Ganesha caused an obstacle when proper worship had not been performed. When Lord Shiva respectfully worshipped him, Ganesha made the undertaking free from obstacles. I bow to that Lord Ganesha.

Spiritual Message

Power alone does not guarantee success. Proper preparation, respect, humility and correction of mistakes are equally important.

Thus ends the Ganesh Stuti traditionally known as Devaih Kritam Ganesh Stotram.

Short Meaning of the Complete Ganesh Stuti

The deities pray to Lord Ganesha as the first worshipped deity and the controller of obstacles. They praise his childhood joy, leadership, wisdom, compassion, mouse vehicle and divine power.

The central prayer may be summarised as:

O Lord Ganesha, guide our thoughts, remove ignorance and pride, help us control restless desires and give us the wisdom to begin and complete our duties properly.

When Should Ganesh Stuti Be Recited?

Ganesh Stuti may be recited on any day. It is especially suitable during:

- Daily morning worship
- Wednesday Ganesh Puja
- Ganesh Chaturthi
- Sankashti Chaturthi
- Angaraki Sankashti
- Weddings and engagement ceremonies
- Housewarming and Vastu Puja
- Opening a business, shop or office
- Beginning a new project
- Starting education or preparing for an examination
- Periods of confusion or difficulty

Morning after bathing is traditionally considered a suitable time, but the Stuti may also be recited in the evening or whenever a quiet moment is available.

How to Recite Ganesh Stuti at Home

1. Prepare the Worship Area

Clean the home altar and place an idol or picture of Lord Ganesha on a clean raised platform.

2. Light a Lamp

Light a ghee or oil lamp and keep it safely away from curtains, children and pets.

3. Offer Simple Puja Items

Depending on availability, offer:

- Turmeric and Kumkum
- Sandalwood paste
- Akshata
- Fresh flowers
- Durva grass
- Modak, Laddoo or fruit

4. Chant the Ganesh Moola Mantra

Om Gam Ganapataye Namah.

Chant it 3, 11 or 21 times.

5. Recite the Opening Prayer

Vakratunda Mahakaya Suryakoti Samaprabha.

Nirvighnam Kuru Me Deva Sarva-Karyeshu Sarvada.

6. Read the Complete Ganesh Stuti

Read every verse slowly and clearly. Understanding the meaning is more important than rushing through the Sanskrit words.

7. Perform Aarti

After the Stuti, sing a Ganesh Aarti such as "Jai Ganesh Jai Ganesh Deva."

8. End with a Prayer

0 Lord Ganesha, grant me clear thinking, humble speech and the strength to perform my duties honestly.

Short Ganesh Stuti for Daily Prayer

When there is not enough time to recite the complete hymn, use this shorter prayer:

Vakratunda Mahakaya Suryakoti Samaprabha.

Nirvighnam Kuru Me Deva Sarva-Karyeshu Sarvada.

Om Gam Ganapataye Namah.

0 Lord Ganesha, remove ignorance from my mind and guide me towards wise and responsible action.

Spiritual Significance of Ganesh Stuti

Reciting Ganesh Stuti may help devotees:

- Strengthen devotion to Lord Ganesha
- Begin important activities with a calm mind
- Reflect on pride and careless behaviour
- Develop patience during difficulties
- Seek wisdom before making decisions
- Practise gratitude and humility
- Continue Hindu traditions within the family
- Understand the symbolism associated with Ganesha

These benefits are based on spiritual faith and personal experience. Prayer should support, not replace, medical care, education, planning or responsible effort.

Difference Between Ganesh Stuti, Mantra and Aarti

| Form | Meaning |

| Ganesh Stuti | A prayer praising the qualities and divine activities of Lord Ganesha |
| Ganesh Stotra | A structured hymn consisting of several Sanskrit verses |
| Ganesh Mantra | A short sacred phrase repeated during meditation or worship |
| Ganesh Aarti | A devotional song sung while offering a lamp |
| Ganesh Chalisa | A longer devotional composition generally consisting of forty verses |

1. What is Ganesh Stuti?

Ganesh Stuti is a devotional prayer that praises the qualities, divine form and spiritual importance of Lord Ganesha.

2. Which Ganesh Stuti is included in this post?

7. Can women recite Ganesh Stuti?

Yes. Women, men, children and elderly devotees may recite it.

8. Can the Stuti be recited without a Ganesh idol?

Yes. It may be recited before a picture or while mentally meditating on Lord Ganesha.

9. Which offering may be made after the Stuti?

Modak, Laddoo, fruit, jaggery, coconut or another fresh Sattvic food may be offered.

10. What should I pray for after Ganesh Stuti?

Pray for wisdom, self-control, good judgement, family welfare and the courage to perform duties honestly.

Conclusion

Ganesh Stuti praises Lord Ganesha as the first worshipped deity, the controller of obstacles, the lord of the Ganas and the guide of wise beginnings.

Its verses describe his divine position, childhood joy, leadership, mouse vehicle and power to remove difficulties after proper worship. More deeply, the hymn teaches devotees to overcome internal obstacles such as pride, confusion, carelessness and uncontrolled desire.

Reading the Sanskrit verses together with their English meaning can make the prayer more understandable and spiritually meaningful.
